Handwriting

Today I would like you to continue practising the days of the week. See the handwriting sheet.

Reading – Keep trying hard with that reading! Maybe you could play a game with the speed words at the back of your book?

English -

Today we are going to Look at some sentences from the Traction Man story.

- 1) Find the adjectives (describing words) and highlight them with a yellow pen or pencil.
- 2) Find the nouns (the things) and highlight them with a pink pen or pencil.
- 3) Find the verbs (the words which describe what the character is doing) and highlight them with a green pen or pencil.
- 4) For each sentence, write a new adjective, noun, and verb, to change the story. This could end up being very funny! Sometimes you might change all of the adjectives, nouns and verbs, but sometimes you might want keep some of them to make it extra funny.. Look at my example below:

Traction Man **rides** **cat** **eating** **fluffy** **slippers**
jumps on the **pillows**. He is **wearing** his **Rocket** **Boots**.

Did that make you laugh? 😊 See if you can make some really funny ones!

Maths - Writing multiplication, using and understanding the x sign.

1) Watch number blocks, to learn about the x sign.

So when we use the times sign (X), it means groups of or lots of:

5 X 2 means 5 groups of 2 or 5 twos. $2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2$

2) Try the worksheet. It has monsters with different numbers of eyes, and you need to write the missing numbers in the boxes to finish the number sentences.
