

## Year 3– The Stone Age to the Iron Age

Imagine you lived in the Stone Age. Draw a picture of how your family and home would have looked and add some labels with some facts.

Have a go at using a coding programme such as 'Scratch' on a computer or tablet to create your own moving images or short video game based on the Stone Age.

Create some stone age themed pebble or rock art. You can use different paints or even add some googly eyes and hair.

How many different natural rocks and stones can you find in your garden? Share a photo with us with their names.

Draw a picture of your favourite stone age animal...will it be a woolly mammoth or a saber-toothed cat! Add some facts.

Use a computer to copy and paste some facts and images about the Stone Age on to a Word document. National Geographic for Kids has some good resources.

Create some Stone Age to Iron Age characters using different materials. Perhaps it could be a lego caveman or a play dough kelt? Share the photo with us.

Retell a poem or short story about the Stone Age and share the video with us. Take a look at Michael Rosen's short poem.

Make your own cave person using a toilet roll tube or other scrap materials from home. Bring it in to school or share a photo. Maybe you could create a whole family!

Bake some Stone Age themed snacks. Perhaps you could make some woolly mammoth biscuits or some cavemen cup cakes? Share the photos with us.

Recreate your own cave art looking at different examples on Google images. With help from an adult you can stain the paper with coffee to make it look authentic.

Write a poem or short story about the Stone Age to the Iron Age. You could also do a short cartoon strip with characters and speech bubbles.

Go on a family day out to one of the Stone Age settlements on and near Bodmin Moor. Stripple Stones, Lanyon Quoit and Men-an-Tol to name a few. Share a photo with us.

Use scrap materials from around the home such as cereal boxes and toilet roll tubes to create a Stone Age animal. The BBC has some good ideas for Stone Age themed craft.

Have a dance or sing along to the 'The Ages of Stone' song by Horrible Histories or find an alternative rock themed song about our topic. Share the video or some photos with us.

What would you have looked like if you were a child in the Stone Age? Draw a self portrait.
