Cooper in Year 4 for his excellent effort and enthusiasm in his learning, especially in our geography and maths lessons. Well done, Cooper!

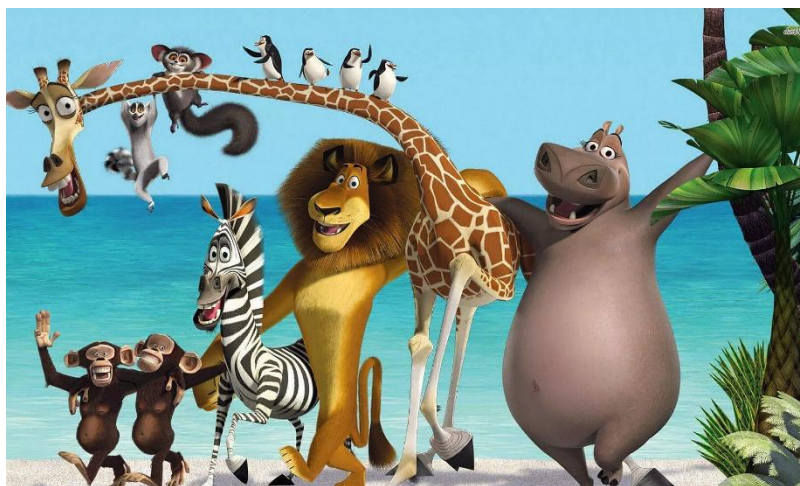

## *This week in school we have...*

This week, Year Five have been working very hard in their writing - writing a balanced argument on screen use in children. In one lesson, all heads were down busy writing away on a paragraph explaining why games and time on screens is beneficial to children!! Lots of very convincing points were made. In our history learning, have been investigating what crimes there were in the Tudor and Georgian times and the very harsh punishments given. Some interesting and quite baffling facts were found out!

This week in Year 1 we have been planning our stories to write next week. We've looked at numbers to 100 and have loved doing some sports day practice. We have enjoyed the sunshine in the woods and much more.

This week in Reception Class, we have explored volume and capacity in maths where the children had so much fun using the water and sand to compare and measure using terms such as full, half full and empty. We have read the Smartest Giant in Town and used the story to talk about kindness, friendship and making good choices.

This week in Year 4, we've been busy exploring the countries of Europe and their capital cities. The children have enjoyed discovering where different nations are located and learning fascinating facts about their capitals. In Maths, we've been learning about triangles, quadrilaterals, and other polygons. The class has been working hard to identify the properties of different shapes and classify them accurately. In English, we are nearing the end of our work on newspaper reports. The children have been preparing to write their own reports by analysing key features and practising their journalistic writing skills.

Year 6 have had a busy week organising last steps for their fundraising afternoon and rehearsing for the production. They have been looking at evolution as part of their English and science topic and managed to get a walk to the park to sketch trees and leaves for a project they are working on. Well done Year 6!

Year 3 have been working really hard to learn to tell the time. It's been really challenging, but they are trying their best and developing their skills. In History we have learnt about China Clay quarrying, and how this has changed the landscape of Cornwall. The children were fascinated to look at Google Earth and see the vast areas of China clay pits. The children are also loving their rehearsals for Madagascar, particularly learning a few Lemur dance moves this week!

This week Year 2 have been busy finding out more about cheetahs and writing more of their reports. They are fast becoming experts. They have also tried super hard with problem solving in maths. On Monday they enjoyed exploring with clay and learning some simple techniques. They have explored more about habitats in science and also began to find out about Rosa Parks and the legacy of her actions. They have loved the warm weather and have also been practising hard for Sports Day.
