Babcock Ambassadors came to visit Year 6. They helped us to create a giant experiment about magnets and how they work. We researched and examined different types of materials and their purposes. We looked at an object, what material it was made from, and if it was magnetic or not. Finally, we were joined by Year 5 and Babcock held a question-and-answer session about their jobs and what they did. We all felt very excited about working in areas of STEM.

The children have also loved researching their own answers to science questions and finding out about food chains - lots of connections this week.

This week Year 2 have been very busy writing recounts of their trip to the zoo. They made sure that they added in a variety of conjunctions as they wrote. In maths they have been exploring multiplication and finding out about the x sign. We got engaged in science week this week with a science investigation into how you can change materials. We also had a visit from the rockpool project and found out about all the exciting creatures in a rockpool. We also drew the disciples' reactions to different parts of the Easter story and made special cards for special people in our lives using levers and sliders.
