## This week in school we have...

This week Year 6 have been busy doing lots of arts and crafts, they have created some amazing crosses which are being sent to Truro for a competition, fingers crossed and good luck to all the children that have entered. This week Year 2 have been busy working on their 2 times table and thinking about how division is related. We even learnt the word inverse. We spent time reading together and exploring different texts. In history we acted out hospitals when Florence was not there and then after she had done her work. We loved using the bandages! We continued to explore Easter in RE and created the most amazing eggs which we have put up in our classroom. We have also enjoyed ICT and PE and spending lots of time outdoors in the sunshine.

This week in Reception Class we have been learning about different types of insects like ladybirds, slugs, millipedes and spiders, looking at things they have in common and the things that are different from each other. We also have been painting and exploring using ink and wax to make patterns.

This week in Year 4, we've continued to explore decimals, diving deeper into hundredths as both fractions and decimals. We've also worked on dividing 1-digit and 2-digit numbers by 10. In our history lessons, we've examined different sources to answer the question: *How great was king Alfred?* In addition, we've been continuing to rehearse for our Easter service performance and are very excited to share it with you next week!

Year 5 have enjoyed PE this week using large apparatus within their gymnastics lessons – fantastic balances were seen and wellcontrolled movements. We have been amazing authors writing biographies about famous scientists, thinking really carefully about our language choices and use of grammar. In our art lesson, we have been experimenting with watercolours and the different ways we can use these – amazing results Year 5 well done! Year 3 have been decorating their Egyptian collars in Art this week, painting jewels on them and creating intricate designs. They have also been adding colour and creativity to their crosses for Truro Cathedral's competition. In Maths they have been learning about capacity and in Literacy they have been completing their diary entries based on Howard Carter's discoveries.

This week Year 1 have been writing animal fact files. They have been reminded of the Easter story and discussed why Jesus washed the feet of his disciples. They have enjoyed some Rugby skills and created some wonderful art work.
