This week in Year 4 we created our own switches in Science, using split pins and paper clips. We then tested these within the circuit to see how effective they were.

This week in Year 2 we have had a great time learning about African and on Wednesday we had a special visitor, Danielle, who talked to us about African culture. We have been working really hard on our secret agent training and today we will be having our special treat – A SLEEPOVER AT SCHOOL!!!!! We are very excited and will let you know how it goes next week. This week Year 1 have been looking at deciduous and evergreen trees and starting to learn what each term means. They have been looking at equal groups in maths and writing their own stories. They have been learning what it means to be part of a faith community.
