Dear Parents and Carers,

Another busy week in school! This week the Reverend Laura led Collective Worship in school. The children explored the Bible story Jesus Feeds the 5,000 – John 6:1–14. Jesus sees that a big crowd is hungry. A boy shares his lunch, and Jesus feeds everyone! Compassion means noticing others' needs and doing something to help. The children have been showing compassion beautifully around the school.

Parents should have received their child's learning for this term as set out in our new planning webs as well as knowledge organisers that show our 'forever knowledge' and key vocabulary. In Reception Class the topic for this term is Superheroes. This week they had a visit from the RNLI, whereas in Year 1 the children have started their topic on castles, we didn't have a visit from any knights! Year 2, as well as looking in more in depth at the Fire of London, have also been exploring materials as part of their science. Year 3 have continued with their Stone Age topic as well looking at rocks in science. In Year 4 the children have started their history topic of Romans. Year 5 are exploring Ancient Greece as well as making links with the solar system. The children in Year 6 are back in school and have shared some of the great experiences that they had whilst away at residential. This week, they have been busy creating beautiful poems for Harvest.

This week in school we have.....

This week Year 2 did some super science work, building bridges and seeing which materials worked the best. They stacked, twisted and stuck the materials together and made some amazing constructions. They have carried on being great writers and thinking really carefully about their BFF. In maths they have continued to develop their place value skills doing some skilful partitioning together. We thought about the story of Matthew the tax collector in RE and created comic strips which they should all be super proud of.

This week in Reception we have been very busy with learning our new sounds 's' and 'd' in Phonics and our numbers 1, 2 and 3 in maths! In our music lessons with Mrs B, we enjoyed moving, clapping and singing along to the beat. We also had a very special visit from the RNLI who taught us all about how they help people stay safe out at sea - the children loved asking questions and learning all about the lifeboats!

This week in Year 5, we have been partitioning numbers all the way up to 1,000,000, learning how to break them down and understand their value. In PSHE, we have been exploring what it means to be a citizen of our country and thinking about the rights and responsibilities we all share. Our Science involved discovering how the heliocentric model helps us understand our universe better and in RE we have been creating our own pictures to share the meaning of Genesis 1 for a Christian, reflecting on the idea of creation.

This week in Year 1 we have been super sports stars. We have continued our numbers to 10 and have been identifying objects, materials and their properties by drawing and labelling them. We created some beautiful pieces of art for the 7 days of creation and much more.

This week Year 4 have been busy writing about unicorns. We have even been out in the woods creating the dens in which they might live and hide. In our art lesson, we have really emoted bringing these to life and using our imagination for all the different breeds put there. In our RE lessons, we have been thinking about the kind of world that Jesus wanted. We have had some interesting discussions around the Gospels and have looked at Matthew 4:18-19 in detail, understanding how the disciples can be 'fishers of men'.

This week in Year 3 we have been discovering what Britain was like at the end of the Ice Age, learning about Neanderthals and Homosapiens. The children used graded drawing pencils to create some super drawings of Ice Age beasts.

Year 6 had a very exciting week at Heatree. They tried lots of new activities and showed compassion, courage and outstanding friendship. We were so proud of them and got so many lovely comments from the Heatree staff. This week, they have started their WWII topic and have started to read the lined book for English, Rose Blanche. They have also started to investigate how Christians live and examine the Gospels of Luke, Mark, John and Matthew. They are very excited as they start their new roles and responsibilities, some are helping with assemblies, some on reception duties to name just a few. Keep up the excellent start Year 6 😊
