#### Changes to Attendance Expectations from 19th August 2024

Where a leave of absence has been unauthorised, penalty notices will be considered in line with Cornwall Council's Code of Conduct for issuing Penalty Notices in respect of unauthorised absence. The Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher will consider the exceptional circumstance before any decision is made to unauthorise a leave of absence request where the issue of a Penalty Notice is required.

Failure to notify and/or request leave of absence in term time, providing at least 5 days' notice may result in all absence being recorded as (O) (unauthorised absence not covered by any other description).

All applications should be made in writing to the Headteacher at least 20 school days prior to the requested leave date. Where the decision is made not to authorise leave in term time, school will inform parent/carers in writing.

Please do not book a holiday before being given permission for absence from the school.

A general guide for parents is leave for any holiday, activity or event that could be arranged during the annual 13-week holiday time would not be authorised.

## This week in school we have...

Year 5 have been very busy rehearsing and preparing for Aladdin this week. They have been focussed, learnt their lines and perfected their acting skills. In our PSHE lessons this week, we have been discussing the topic of 'change' and thinking ahead to our teenage years. The pictures children have created of what they think they will look like in 6-8 years are lovely.

This week in Reception we have started looking at how we talk about the time, and talking through the order in which we do things. We have also been continuing our Snail and the Whale postcards which are coming on beautifully. In RE we have been looking at what stories are important to us and why. This week in Year 4 we have had a very busy week with all the rehearsal practices and shows. In between these, we have been looking at charts and graphs in math. We have studied different types of charts and how they can be used, before solving word problems about the data within these graphs.

This week Year 2 have been really busy writing amazing reports about lions. They have also been problem solving in maths. They have enjoyed finishing their unit of work in RE and worked hard in science thinking about what pets need to survive.

This week Year 3 have been making the bodies for their pirate puppets from fabric, creating an outfit for them and even added some accessories such as treasure chests and swords. They have also been amazing in their first KS2 production of Aladdin. What a busy week!

This week Year 1 have been learning about direction and making leaflets about the seaside 100 years ago.

Year 6 started the week finalising costumes and getting extra rehearsals in for their Aladdin production, the show was absolutely incredible. It would certainly smash any London box office hit! I am so proud of them. They've also been finalising their scripts for their Leavers' Assembly and writing special cards to each other to share next week.
