This week in school we have...

What a busy week in Reception Class! We have been learning more about our emotions and how we react to some of our bigger feelings. We have been learning about sharing and being kind friends. We have been doing lots of singing and moving our bodies to wake ourselves up when we need extra energy. We have been learning to find fewer than a given number and what equal amounts mean both in the classroom and in the world around us.

As part of our English unit of work, Year 5 brought in an object which is special to them. We had some lovely discussions around why these are special and then completed some amazing writing. In our woods session, we built fabulous dens to keep our special objects safe. In our RE lessons this week, we looked at what the Bible says God is like and used this for our artwork.

This week Year 3 have been planning their independent write inspired by the story, 'The Secret of Black Rock' and have been brainstorming in groups. They have also been learning about Stone Age People, looking at evidence from cave paintings and then creating their own cave paintings using oil pastels. Year 6 have had a fantastic week! They have been practising for the Harvest Festival and designing a cover for the Order of Service. They have been getting their heads round rounding 6 digit numbers and adding and subtracting integers. In History, they have been learning more about WWII and using maps to see how the war spread and which countries were involved. In English, they have been revisiting semi-colons and how to use them in their war stories. They have been super busy.

> This week, Year 4 have been busy taking on the role of Celtic spies! The class investigated what Roman soldiers wore, examining the different parts of their armour and weapons. In science, we've been exploring the fascinating world of states of matter, investigating how water can change between a solid, liquid and a gas. Meanwhile, our creativity has come to life as we've started working on our special artwork for the upcoming Harvest Festival – we can't wait to share it with you all!

This week Year 2 have loved being history detectives and have explored lots of different sources about the great fire. They have also done some super writing and created some amazing sound words. In maths they have been comparing numbers carefully and using their knowledge of tens and ones. They designed the most amazing fire engines this week as well and can't wait to make them.

This week in Year 1 we have been completing our own stories of Little Red Riding Hood, learning our song for harvest, throwing in cricket and completing our numbers to 10.
