This week in school we have...

What an amazing last week of the half term we have had in Reception Class. We have been finishing our topic on people in the community who help us and finished this with our dress up day. We have had a visit from the ambulance service, looked at how paramedics help us and doctors and nurses too. In maths we have been looking at 2D shapes and learning their names and what is similar and different with them.

Year 6 have had a very busy week! Thankyou Jack, Seth and Kacey who have all brought things to show linked to our WWII topic. We have been dabbling with different methods of division. Our art topic is Henry Moore and his shelter drawings, we have been using wax and water colours to practise our wax resistance technique. We continued our History with finding out how Britain defended themselves against the Germans. The children are really enjoying their topic work.

Year 5 have been budding authors writing their own extended stories and showcasing all the amazing English skills they have been developing through the term so far. They have all worked exceptionally hard on these and have really enjoyed writing these. We have concluded our science topic and are using our art skills to show the different phases of the moon. In our RE unit of work, we have also been finishing off our sketches on a range of cathedrals and discussing what is special about these.

This week Year 3 made some great observational drawings of natural objects in the woods this week. They found some interesting places to sit and draw too, as you will see in the photos! We have also been investigating the mystery of Stone Henge, exploring the evidence and making theories as to how and why it was built. The children followed this up by making some super chalk and charcoal drawings of the stones. This week Year 4 have been hard at work polishing their independent writing pieces, showcasing their creativity and skills. In maths, we've continued to tackle addition and subtraction, building confidence with problem-solving. Our history lessons have been exciting as we've begun exploring what life was like after the Romans settled in Britain, uncovering fascinating details about the changes they brought. To top it all off, we've wrapped up our amazing cricket sessions, where the students have shown incredible progress and teamwork!

This week Year 2 have had a really fun week. They have been making their fire engines in DT and then writing about what they liked about them and how they can improve them. They made some super choices and used axles and wheels carefully. In science we went into the woods and explored how heat changed food as part of our materials topic. We have reinforced the maths concepts we have learnt this term and had a lovely time teaching others about the great fire of London.

This week Year 1 have been super writers writing the story of Charlie the Firefighter. We have continued looking at part whole models and number bonds. We enjoyed our movie afternoon and much more.
