#### This week in school we have...

This week Year 2 have been writing about a charity shop and an antique shop. They have been thinking about similes and adjectives. They have powered through their maths and are amazing at comparing and ordering numbers. They have also been amazing history detectives finding the best source of evidence about the Great Fire of London. This week Year 2 have also started our new mastery number sessions and are loving the rekenrek resource.

This week Year 1 have been reading the story of Knuffle Bunny and planning our own stories using a story map. We have been learning the concept of 'fewer' in maths and comparing numbers. We did some throwing and catching in P.E and wrote about properties of materials in science.

This week Reception class had two very exciting visitors. The RNLI and firefighters came into school on Monday to talk to the class as part of our topic. We learnt all about keeping safe at the beach and how to shout for help. We also got to wash the teachers cars when using the hose on the fire engine! Year 6 have been adding the finishing touches to their performance about Heatree. We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> October. They are enjoying our English book Goodnight Mister Tom and they have written some amazing sentences ready for their own WWII stories. They have really impressed me again this week with their prior learning linked to rounding numbers, they have recalled facts and rules which will help with their progress even more. Mrs Williams is so proud of them.

Year 3 have had an exciting time again this week. In our woods session they travelled back in time to the Old (Paleolithic) Stone Age and imagined what life would have been like. After learning about Stone Age homes, the children then roleplayed creating shelters and becoming hunter gatherers. In the yurt they recreated a huge cave painting using chalk pastels. We then continued our hunter gathering by harvesting apples from our apple tree to turn into something delicious next week!

This week year 4 have been continuing on with writing their own version of 'The Lost Thing'. They really enjoyed making and describing a 'thing' that they had made themselves. We have also completed a Science experiment this week, involving chocolate and how its state changes when heated.

This week in Year 5 we have seen some amazing creations for our Chilli Challenge space homework. we've had cake, a letter from an alien and lots of lovely informative posters - well done Year 5. In our RE learning, we have been looking at cathedrals and using our recent learning of sketching to produce some amazing pictures of these. We are all really enjoying finding out about Greece and identifying some of the physical features of this amazing country.
