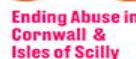

## Cornwall Schools Football County Final Week

This week saw us qualify an unprecedented 3 teams in the Cornwall Schools County Finals Week (Boys Small Schools, Girls Small Schools, Girls Large Schools) at Charlestown F.C.

First up on Monday was the Girls Large Schools Cup. We first had to negotiate a tough Semi Final against St Mewan. They put up a good fight but we eventually secured our place in the Final with a solid 4-1 victory. In the Final we were up against Archbishop Benson. In a tight game, which could have gone either way, we were just pipped at the post by Benson, who deserved their County title, with us as Runners Up.

Next up was the Boys Small Schools Final on Tuesday against St Minver. In a thrilling match we equalized deep into the second half to make it 2-2, and we were unlucky not to get a late winner. The match went to extra-time, and with the match just about to go to penalties, St Minver scored a late winner. The team were devastated, but should be very proud of their performance.

Lastly, on Wednesday, it was the turn of the girls again, in the Girls County Small Schools Final against Truro. To round off a truly spectacular season, the girls romped to a brilliant 6-1 win to become County Small Schools Champions.

## *This week in school we have...*

This week Year 6 have worked incredibly hard in their SATs. They have shown all of our school values plus many more. They have had plenty of fun in the sunshine with Mr Brown and enjoyed the most amazing breakfasts. Thankyou Nicky and Anne. We finished the week with a movie and some games. Your children have been amazing and I am sure you are incredibly proud of them as we are.

This week in Reception Class, we have finished our amazing Gruffalo creations by carefully adding his features! To help us we rewatched and listened to the story of the Gruffalo to help identify what parts of him we can put onto our own. We also started to think about making our own terrible creature which can be used to scare the mouse and the Gruffalo himself! In phonics we learnt about the digraphs ee , ow , oo and the trigraph igh and in maths we have been practising our doubling.

This week, Year 5 have been learning about angles in maths and how to draw and measure these – they've all been trying so hard with using protractors. We enjoyed being able to get outside for our PE and woods sessions this week – the team work and support seen in these lessons from all the children has been fabulous. As part of RE, we have been learning to find Bible references and learning about the story of Moses, when he might have had to trust in God and then we have reflected upon our own times where we may have found things tricky. A super week – well done Year 5.

This week Year 3 have been learning about farming in Cornwall. They've looked on Google Earth to discover how much land is used for farming and have investigated what is grown and produced in Cornwall. They have also learnt about the legend of the Mermaid of Zennor and read the story of the Mousehole cat which is set in Cornwall.

This week we have been super busy in Year 2 being secret agents. We are all totally amazing and Mrs Oakes is very proud of us all. In science we learnt more about micro habitats and then went into the woods to create our own. Check out the amazing one created by some of the boys in the class. In RE we listened to stories about the prophet Muhammad and then thought about what this taught us about him. We have enjoyed the sunshine and are very much looking forward to our watery mission on Friday night.

This week in Year 1 we have been completing our Maths work around grouping and sharing. We have looked at wild and garden flowers. We grouped them in the woods and then made mandalas with them. In R.E we looked at belonging to groups and families. In our seaside topic we created a mime in pairs to show what people did at the seaside over 100 years ago.

This week Year 4 have been writing their very own fantasy stories, and they are sounding amazing. In RE, we've been exploring Hindu Dharma, delving into religious texts to understand their meanings. We've discussed how these teachings guide Hindus in how they believe they should live their lives, and the children have shown great curiosity and respect in their reflections. In Science, we experimented with different materials to investigate whether they are insulators or conductors. There was lots of hands-on learning and brilliant teamwork as we tested, predicted, and recorded our findings.

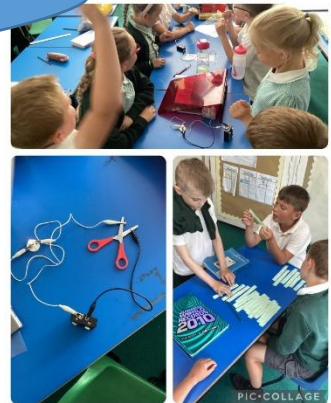
