### This week in school we have...

This week Year 5 have had a busy week and have been working hard as always. In maths we have been reading a range of data in tables and graphs and looking at balanced arguments in English. In our art session, we sketched out ideas for livening up an area of a town and thinking of ideas for street art.

This week Year 3 have another busy week learning about world issues in RE, taking part in a music workshop, improving their swimming skills and learning about different plants and trees in Science.

This week in Reception Class we have been starting to write our character descriptions about the Gruffalo, and a little writing about the Singing Mermaid. We are looking at capacity in maths and how to describe different amounts. We have made collages in art and been painting with water colours mixing the correct colours that we need. This week in Year 4 we have been looking into modern place names that originated from the Vikings. We spent some time exploring and discussing the different Viking names for farm, settlement and village. After this, we used the atlases to explore modern England, looking for places that still have these Viking names!

This week Year 2 have embarked on a literacy project finding out about how to write reports about big cats, we have already found out lots of facts. In maths we have been problem solving and in science we have found out about animals and their offspring. We have also enjoyed exploring clay, ready for creating our African huts next week.

This week Year 1 have been phonics superstars!

Year 6 have had another busy week fundraising for their Year 6 Trip. They have sold lots of ice-creams and are getting ready to sell milkshakes next week! They have also been using Excel to transfer their statistical skills into spreadsheets and produce a variety of different graphs. They really enjoyed the sessions and are now very proficient at researching and inputting data, creating a series of graphs appropriate to show their data collection and input titles, legends and change colours etc. In RE, we are using our new Bibles to look for evidence on how people saw Jesus as our Saviour and Messiah. I love teaching them RE as they have such mature opinions and ask really interesting questions.
