This week in school we have...

Year 5 have had a lovely week together. In our RE learning, we have been looking at the big frieze and discussing the different elements of this. Using watercolours, we designed and painted some rather strange creatures which we have imagined may live upon another planet. In our English lesson, these have been brought to life with descriptive writing. It is also lovely to see lots of chilli challenge homework being celebrated. This week in Year 4 have been buzzing with excitement as we dove into a variety of new topics and experiences! In Maths, we've been working hard on partitioning 4-digit numbers, sharpening our understanding of place value. In PSHE, we've been discussing what it means to be a responsible school citizen and how we can make our school community even better. In Science we've had fun learning about particles and how they behave in solids, liquids and gases. We've been making the most of our new library, discovering a love for reading in this fantastic space. We've also enjoyed exploring the woods, where we've been connecting with nature. What a wonderful start it's been so far!

Wow, what an amazing start to Reception Class. We have been learning all about what it means to be a member of Bishop Cornish and making new friends. We have been starting our phonics and learning our first couple of sounds already. We have also made a wonderful start to our maths learning.

This week Year 3 have been creating music with the Gamelan orchestra and have begun their Stone Age topic by looking at historical timelines. They have also done some painting based around Creation for PE. This week Year 2 have enjoyed lots of fun activities, particularly involving food. They explored baking as part of their literacy topic and made buns as presents for loved ones at home. In maths they have been using tens and ones to make numbers. They did super PE with Mr Brown and explored what it takes to be able to change the world in RE and why Jesus chose the special people that he did. The children loved exploring watercolours in art and did some super colour mixing.

This week Year 1 have been thinking of some adjectives to describe an unusual pet. They have been superstar mathematicians and they started and they started their learning about Grace Darling.
