This week in school we have...

This week in Reception Class we have worked on creating Dinosaur Fact Files and have made up our own verses for a dinosaur song! In maths we have started to work on addition to 10.

This week Year 5 have been writing absolutely amazing stories about a group of children who have been stranded in the Amazon Rainforest...how will they survive? We put our survival skills to the test in the woods this week, using drama to help our learning. In our gymnastics, we have been looking at balances and working individually, in pairs and groups to create balances which use tension and counter tension. We have also been working hard in our science lessons, learning about flowering plants.

This week Years 3 have been discovering Ancient Egyptian beliefs about the Afterlife. After learning about some of the many Gods and Goddesses, they created these beautiful drawings and water colour paintings - they really are great artists! This week they have also been measuring in Maths, learning to measure accurately in centimetres and millimetres, as well as estimating and comparing lengths. They have explored baptism in RE and learnt the difference between an Infant baptism and a Believer's baptism.

This week, Year 4 have been busy finishing off their incredible river poems, which they have thoroughly enjoyed creating. The poems sound fantastic and really showcase their creativity and imagination! In Maths, the children have been fully engaged with our new unit on fractions, diving into the world of numerators and denominators with enthusiasm. In History, we've been investigating the fascinating Anglo-Saxon discoveries from Sutton Hoo, exploring who the items might have belonged to and what they reveal about life during that time. It's been an exciting week of learning, and we can't wait to see what next week brings!

This week Year 2 have had a wonderful time exploring Victorian toys and experimenting with printing in the same way as William Morris. They have been planning a new story in literacy based on Stardust and have been exploring money in maths. The children made some wonderful service sheets for a church service in RE and enjoyed making music with instruments for their band.

This week Year 1 have been plotting and planning an adventure story to the South Pole. They have been detectives in history finding evidence to support statements about Captain Scott's journey. They have been sorting animals into groups and have started to learn about the different animal groups.

We did it! In Year 6, our maps of Baghdad are complete. The children showed great teamwork and perseverance to complete them, and were then able to give a fabulous presentation to explain what they had done. Well done Year 6.
