### This week in school we have...

This week in Reception class we have been looking at a range of different fairy tales including The Three Little Pigs and Cinderella. We have been looking at retelling the story and ordering the pictures into a story map and looking at how the characters from the stories feel at different parts along their journeys. We have made a wonderful start to learning our number bonds to 5 and are working hard on our reading and

This week in Year 2 the children have started to write their diary entries from the viewpoint of a rat. They had great fun acting out what they thought the rat might want to say. In maths they have been using their super number bond knowledge to help them become quicker at addition. They listened to some very calming music in RE and then explored the Lord's Prayer through drama. They have also been super busy with the Christmas play and we are so proud of their line learning!!

Year 5 have been investigating the weight and mass of a selection of objects, reading Newton metres and scales accurately. We have been learning about gravity and how Isaac Newton discovered this. In our lessons, we have been researching the Islamic faith locally and discovering mosques in the southwest of England. Year 5 have also worked particularly hard in their English lessons linking their learning to our Ancient Greek topic and dress up day last week.

This week in Year 4, the children have been working hard! In maths, they have been mastering multiplication with a focus on the 3, 6, 7, and 9 times tables. In English, the children have been crafting exciting and engaging opening sentences for their holiday brochures about Sicily, bringing the island to life with their imaginative writing. They've also started writing detailed instructions for creating their Roman shields, combining creativity with precision.

This week in Year 1 we have been writing our final plot points of the adventure story ready to write them next week. We have been rehearsing our hearts out and we went in the woods in the cold weather and enjoyed geography and PSHE with ©

This week Year 3 have been designing their own Bronze Age jewellery. They have been exploring the changes from Bronze age to Iron Age, focussing particularly on how life changed on Dartmoor, and what evidence we have of human settlers there. They have also experienced some snow on the playground this week and enjoyed playing outside with the rest of the juniors! This week in RE Year 6 have been hot seating and have been asking questions to Mary and Joseph (members of our class), about their journey to Bethlehem. We have been looking at Voltage in Science and looking at how the voltage of a battery affects the brightness of a bulb. In English we have been practising our persuasion, to charm Mr Scrooge, and Year 6 playtime leaders have been busy keeping the other year groups entertained during our very wet lunchtimes.
