This week in school we have......

This week Year 2 have been recalling and then extending their learning about the Great fire of London. They have been learnt in about diaries and what you need to make a diary in preparation for writing their own. They have explored how we change materials in science and thought about the different properties of materials. In RE they planned peaceful pictures based on the work of Hannah Dunnett and are looking forward to creating them next week.

We have had a lovely week back in Reception Class after half term! Our new topic is Traditional Tales and this week we read The Gingerbread Man. The children enjoyed joining in with the story and talking about what happened to the gingerbread man! In RE, we have started to learn about the Nativity and the story of baby Jesus' birth where we explored the characters of the story and why it is so special to Christians. In phonics we've been looking at k and c where we've started to practise blending and writing words such as 'man' and 'pin' and in maths we have been learning about changes within 5. It's been a great start to this half term!

This week in Year 5, we have been working on multi-step problems in maths, using both addition and subtraction. In history, we compared the lives of the Ancient Greeks who lived in Sparta and Athens. The class enjoyed discussing the similarities and differences between the two citystates and made thoughtful decisions about which one they would have preferred to live in. In RE, we have been exploring our world views thinking about what shapes the way we see the world and how our beliefs and experiences influence our choices and values.

Year 6 have worked so hard this week and showed positive mindsets to their learning. They have written up their WWII stories, they are amazing so we will make them into a reading compilation so that other children can read them. In Maths, we have been learning the four operations using Year 6 methods. This week we looked at multiplying four digit numbers by one and two digits and they also learnt short division to divide a four digit number by one digit. They used our new chrome books to create graphs using data from WWII to show how many children were evacuated across different countries. They used Excel to input their date, then created a variety of graphs to show their findings. Well done Year 6 😉

This week in Year 1 we have been starting our new stories based on the book *The way back home*. We have been looking at number bonds in maths focusing on fact families. In science we started to explore absorbent and non-absorbent, we did gymnastics in P.E and much more.

Year 4 have had a super start back to school. In our English lessons, we have been writing brilliant adventure stories based upon the structure of 'The Iron Man'. We had fun at the start of the week thinking about the reasons for and against Claudius invading Britain...why would he want to leave sunny Italy and come to England? This involved a very animated conscience alley and 'discussions' in groups. We are really enjoying using our new chrome books in school to enhance our learning...Times Tables Rockstars is a hit with Year 4!

This week Year 3 have got stuck into exploring the Bronze Age. We have found out how discovering how to smelt Bronze changed life for people, and watched a video recreating the making of a Bronze axe head. The children then took a close look at images of Bronze Age jewellery, making some beautiful pen drawings. These will be used in DT in the coming weeks to inspire our own designs for rings and necklaces. Our reading this week has linked in nicely with our topic, using an information text to learn more about the Stone Age village of Skara Brae.
