This week in Reception

In maths we started learning how to tell the time where the children enjoyed using clocks in their play, prompting discussions about their daily routines. In English, the class has been writing up their historical reports on the Raid on Lindisfarne, drawing on what they've learned about this dramatic event in history. In RE, we explored the Sacred Thread Ceremony, learning about its significance and symbolism in the Hindu religion, creating out own invitations to this event.

They had an amazing day on Tuesday at their transition visit and were very excited to come back and share all the things they had done and teachers they had met.
