Yes – it was absolutely delicious! Year 6 then had to work hard as they became a human calculator! Perhaps they were working out the number of calories consumed!


Please remember that, for KS2 children, school meals cost £2.30. If you are paying by cheque please make the cheques payable to 'Caterlink.' Sadly, the 5 meals for 4 no longer applies. Caterlink do operate a 'no-debt' policy which means all meals must be paid for.

Also, we do have a number of children and staff with severe allergies, the most common being nuts. Please could we ask you to consider this when preparing packed lunches and avoid including nut products. Thank you.
