# This week in school we have...

This week in Year 6 we have been working really hard on our practise SATs and the children have all shown a positive attitude to their SATs. We have also learnt about Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday. They have done a question-and-answer session in RE around Good Friday and Easter Sunday and have been rewarded for their hard work with pancakes, which went down a treat. Then we thought about what we are thankful for and wrote it on pancakes.

What an amazing week we have had in reception. We have enjoyed World Book Day. We have been discovering where plants come from and how all seeds and bulbs are different for different rent plants. We have also started to look at our

This week Year 3 have embraced World Book Day with lots of creativity and imagination, celebrating their favourite authors and books and enjoying activities around the theme of stories and adventures. They have also been exploring the school woods and working in teams to problem solve for RE and as part of our topic about Ancient Egypt.

Year 5 have made the most incredible Mayan masks which are being proudly displayed within our classroom. In our history topic, we have also thought carefully about what life was like at the height of the Mayan civilisation and have written diary entries as if we are time travellers. In our maths, we have been working really hard on our fractions, learning how to find the quantity of an amount. Year 5 are enjoying their RE topic about Creation v Science and in our lessons this week, we have been discussing what Christians might see as important in Genesis 1.

This week Year 2 have loved writing ideas for a poem about being in charge of the world! They have lots they would like to change. In maths we have begun looking at making equal groups. They loved cooking pancakes in the woods and apparently they tasted delicious!! They have continued working on the Easter story in RE and have enjoyed playing glockenspiels to reggae music - a very busy week.

This week in Year 4, the children have been writing some fantastic sentences for our balanced arguments in English, focusing on presenting both sides of an issue with clear reasoning whilst developing our grammar techniques within them too. In Maths, we've been applying our knowledge of fractions to solve addition and subtraction word problems, strengthening our problem-solving skills. In Science, we were fortunate to have a visit from a veterinary nurse who shared fascinating information about different animals, which tied in perfectly with our studies on habitats. The children engaged really well with the activities and it sparked a real interest for them too.

This week in Year 1 we have been writing a draft recount, adding and subtracting, making pancakes on Shrove Tuesday, celebrating World Book day and much, much more.
