This week Year 2 have shone like stars in the nativity. They were amazing at their lines and helped the younger children with so much compassion. In maths they have been amazing with shape. The highlight of the week was our chocolate road experiment. The children Johnny designed McAdams inspired roads and tested them before tucking in and checking they tasted yummy!

This week in Year 5, we have been comparing and ordering fractions in our maths lessons. In English, we have focused uplevelling sentences by practising how to use powerful adjectives, subordinate clauses, and relative clauses to improve simple sentences. In science, we explored the impact water resistance has on moving objects and how different designs help to reduce it.

This week in Year 4 we have been working really hard examining the characters in the story of Aladdin. We've done lots of problem-solving in maths. We have also learnt about the history of Christingle and started working on our Christmas stocking.

What a magical week we've had in Reception Class! The children have been busy with all things Nativity and we couldn't be prouder of them. After weeks of practising songs, lines and actions, they took to the stage for their performances – some for the very first time in front of an audience – and they were fantastic! We hope you enjoyed the show as much as we did. Also this week, the children have started to make some Christmas crafts which they can't wait to share with their grown ups soon!

This week Year 1 were Superstars! We also wrote some letters to Father Christmas telling them about our Cheeky Elves! We have enjoyed making paper chains in RE and getting Christmassy! We also watched the live assembly from Antarctica to give us some idea of our new Topic next term.

Year 3 had a fabulous journey back in time on Tuesday this week. They were all issued with a time traveller's passport and headed back in time to the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. They tried out lots of different crafts including Bronze Age jewellery making, Iron Age weaving, exploring what they could create from clay, and attempting to build their own Stone Henge. They were super throughout the day and we all enjoyed the experience.

Year 6 had a lovely afternoon this week, watching KS1 perform their Nativity; it was brilliant and they thoroughly enjoyed it. We have been concluding the persuasive letters to Mr Ebeneezer Scrooge and they are all doing really well with showcasing their Year 6 SPaG. Their persuasive language is really good so watch out!
