This week in school we have...

This week in Reception Class we have been carrying with our topic of heroes in our community with a fantastic visit from three of our local fire service who talked to us about fire safety and smoke detectors. We got to look around the fire engine and practise using fire hoses, some lucky staff got a free car wash! We have also been exploring 3D shapes and learning to name them, practising our cutting skills as well as building traps to protect our classroom from Evil Pea!

As part of our PSHE and understanding why we have rules in society, Year 5 invented their own games using natural objects found in our woods. They came up with some really creative ideas and clear rules on how to lay their games. In our history lesson, we travelled back to the times of Ancient Greece and with everyone in role as a character we explored who we might meet at the Agora. We have also seen some fabulous space project homework: yummy biscuits from Harlequin and fun space themed games from Eliza and Shara.

This week Year 3 have been learning about the Christian creation story in RE and creating their own colour palettes in Art using a range of primary and secondary colours. They have also discovered facts about fossils, dinosaurs and Mary Anning in Science with links to our topic about the Stone Age. Year 6 kickstarted the week with a very informative session led by Tim Parkman. They discussed Christianity and how Christians support charities, particularly at this time of year. They have been reading about Greta Thunberg as part of their morning reading exercise, looking at the impact of global warming and how we can help our environment. They also highlighted key features of a non-fiction text, and different fonts and presentation skills used in the article. In maths, they are revisiting multiplying and dividing. In Year 6, this involves multiplying up to 6 digits by 2 digits using formal methods. On Friday, they are having a very exciting science session, using DT skills to create an air raid shelter as part of the cross -curricular history topic.

This week in Year 4, students have been diving into the fascinating world of the water cycle. In history, we explored the intriguing figure of Boudica, examining historical texts to imagine what she might have looked like. In literacy, students began planning their independent writing projects, utilising their knowledge of fantastics and grammaristics to enhance their storytelling skills. We can't wait to see their creativity shine through.

This week Year 2 went recycling crazy and sorted lots of rubbish while they found out about how we recycle and why. In maths they looked at the three times table and in literacy they wrote the most amazing stories. In history this week we looked at why the fire spread so quickly and the children came up with lots of good ideas. Another busy week in Year 2!

This week in Year 1 the children were historians, we did an investigation looking for evidence around the room to confirm statements we had about Grace Darling. We have also been looking at addition fact families and enjoying music and cricket.
