## This week in school we have...

This week Year 5 have been working really hard on their creative writing and enjoying the story 'The Explorers'. In the woods, children experienced having to survive as if they were stranded in the Amazon...would they get out in one piece? In our PSHE lessons, the children have been exploring different jobs, careers and thinking about goals for the future. This week in Year 4 we explored some sections of the Bayeux Tapestry! We were then given one quarter of a section with the task of drawing the rest of the piece. The piece we looked at told the story of King Harold praying for a safe voyage, the class got really stuck into this activity and had a good attempt at drawing their own piece. I can't wait to see the finished article!

This week Year 3 have been designing Egyptian jewellery in Art and planning their independent writing about a robotic pet in Literacy. They have also been working as part of a team within PSHE to design a garden and learning different animal vocabulary in Spanish.

This week Reception Class thought more about how dinosaurs lived and looked at dinosaur skeletons. They also really enjoyed their visit from the dentist, thinking about how to keep their teeth clean. They continued watching the 'egg' in the classroom hatch and finally discovered inside was a baby T-Rex!

This week Year 1 have been revisiting Scott's mission and reflecting on his highs and lows. We have been understanding how numbers up to 20 are made up of 10's and one's. In writing we are now writing our own Alien adventure. This week there has been great scientific excitement in Year 2. Our bean experiment has been producing some very interesting results and the children have been so excited about talking about what they can see. They have done some super maths and English work. They loved finding out about the vile Victorian conditions in factories and were horrified that they may have had to go to work.

Year 6 have continued to look at algebra and understanding expressions. Ask them about it as they are so proud of their understanding and learning. They have concluded their work on The Journey so are planning their big write; they have loved this picture book as it relates to their history topic. In science, they have been writing about their visit from the Ocean Conservation Trust. They are going to be revisiting their experiments on their Harry Potter day (in science week), you will hear more about this before half term. Next week, they are going up to Saltash School to watch their performance of Oliver so you will hear about that next week!
