This week in Year 6 we have been preparing for SATs and revisiting things that have been tricky. In History we are looking at the Tudors. We have drawn portraits of what we think Henry the VIII may have looked like. We talked about how his portraits changed and he never seemed to look the same.

This week Year 2 have hit the ground running with their learning. They have been amazing at multiplying and dividing by 5 and have started looking at a new book 'The Owl who was afraid of the dark'. They have begun to find out more about the Muslim faith in RE and have been discussing living things in science. They also enjoyed an amazing dojo treat of going to the park where they played and had biscuits.

Year 5 have had a super start to the Summer term. We have begun our topic 'Crime and Punishment' and have discussed how we know about crimes 800 years ago. We enjoyed looking at a picture showing the story of the 'fox and the goose'. In our science lesson, we carried out an investigation to test different materials for properties to answer questions as to if the materials are electrical conductors and/or magnetic. Everyone has worked their hardest

- well done.

This week, Year 4 continued developing their understanding of decimals, focusing on how they can be partitioned in different ways. The children practised expressing decimals using various representations to deepen their conceptual understanding. In Science, we explored the dangers of electricity. The children discussed potential hazards and learned important safety measures to help prevent accidents in everyday situations. As part of our history topic, we began to unpick our perceptions of the Vikings. We looked at the image we often have of Vikings and started investigating why this image exists and what it might be based on.

This week in Year 1 we have started our class book Grandad's Island. We drew some old things that would have been in Grandad's attic and thought of some negative adjectives to describe them. We have been also thinking about the parable of Jonah and the big fish.
