This week in school we have...

This week Year 6 have been busy using their business skills to fundraise for their end of year trip to the Hobbit Houses. They have learnt lots of new language such as expenditure, enterprise, balance sheets. They have used IT to write to the PTA for match funding and for creating advertisements for marketing their fundraising activities.

This week Year 1 have started reading Oliver Jeffers' story, 'The Way Back Home', learning about space in literacy and finding out about our new local Spaceport in Newquay. They have also been busy identifying 2D and 3D shapes that they can see in the classroom and around the school.

This week Reception class have been busy being scientists whilst trying to figure out what is inside the egg and have learnt about Mary Anning and her discoveries. They have also been exploring the number 10, working together to make a number line and find different ways to make 10.

This week Year 4 have had a busy week beginning their poetry unit of work which is based on rivers. We began the week by learning about the different aspects of rivers and then building a model river system in our woods sessions. In our RE lesson, we learnt all about not judging a book by its cover...the children will tell you what was in Mrs. Jones' lunchbox! We have also been super busy in maths learning times tables and division facts, then applying our maths skills to produce snippets of code in our computing sessions.

This week we have been sewing backstitch on our Tudor money pouches. We have been completing a scrapyard challenge in science. In R.E. we have thought about the qualities that Noah had that meant God chose him to survive the great flood. We have also been enjoying swimming and gymnastics and thinking about our dreams and goals.

Year 2 have been really busy this week perfecting the ability to subtract 2 digit numbers across a 10. They have even been able to have a go at doing it by drawing the tens and ones to help them. In literacy we have been continuing exploring and writing about the story of stardust. We have been doing a great job of using alliteration in our writing. We loved PE with Mr Brown this week and climbed very high. We found out about Queen Victoria and remembered lots of facts about her, worked out what we need to survive in science and thought about how we might look after some different pets. It has been a very busy week!

*This week Year 5 have explored the start of WWII and what life was like for children in Germany and England. We continued to explore the book *Rose Blanche* in English and listen to music from that era. In Art, the children recreated propaganda posters and our photograph this week shows some of the beautiful examples. In Maths, Year 5 are comparing and adding fractions.*
