This week in Reception Class we have been very busy looking at harvest, what this means and how we get our food! We looked at where different food comes from and how it gets to the supermarkets. We made bread, having watched a video on the corn being harvested from the fields and then milled into flour. We also made some butter to go with the bread, which we enjoyed during our story time at the end of the day.

Year 6 have had an outstanding week! They led the Harvest Festival professionally and with passion. They designed front covers for the Order of Service and reflected how Harvest Festival can help charities and their communities. They have continued to write their war stories and are nearing the end, ready for the final write up showcasing all the grammar they have learnt. In maths, they have been creating posters for prime numbers, multiples and factors. They designed them, defining examples and rules which another class could use to support them in their maths. Well done Year 6.

Year 5 have been busy this week working hard in all of their learning. They particularly enjoyed orienteering, having to answer maths questions at the different stations they found.
