This week in school we have.....

This week Year 2 were very busy designing their own fire engine which included axles and wheels. They can't wait to have a making day soon. They finished their story exploration and had lots of super adjective ideas to describe the fluffy itty bitty. In maths they went addition and subtraction crazy and showed that they knew lots of number facts. They loved harvest festival and performed their play brilliantly.

This week in Reception, we have been learning all about Harvest! The children have learnt about the importance of Harvest and how we can show our gratitude to others during this special time of year. In preparation for our whole school Harvest celebration, we joined the rest of the school at church to rehearse our song, "Busy for the Harvest" ahead of performing it to our families. For many of the children, it was their first time performing in front of an audience and we are incredibly proud of them. Later in the week, we had a visit from some local police officers. Everyone was so excited to meet real-life community helpers and loved hearing all about the important jobs the police do to keep us safe.

This week, Year 5 have been busy preparing for our wonderful Harvest Festival. The children impressed everyone with their ukulele performances and read their poem with great confidence. In history, we explored the lives of women in Ancient Greece, using a range of historical artefacts and books to deepen our understanding. During our RE lessons, we continued our inquiry into the question: *How and why do some Christians see both science and religion as important?* The children have shared thoughtful ideas and enjoyed some very interesting discussions.

Year 6 led our Harvest Festival with confidence and passion this week. They practised their lines and really wowed us in church. They have been reflecting on our collective worship and painted some beautiful harvest scenes using watercolours. I can't wait for them to write up their WWII stories next week, their sentences today create amazing imagery and are so emotive using similes and repetition for effect. In maths, they have been revisiting common factors and multiples, again with studios and positive mindsets. I am so proud of them.

This week Year 1 were superstar performers at the Harvest Festival. We were super scientists with our sink and float predictions, we started to write our own version of Little Red Riding Hood and much more. 😊

This week Year 4 finished their amazing Roman Mosaics on fruits and vegetables. They have been really creative, placing each tile with great accuracy. We have been working super hard in our maths, using place value counters to help us to understand how addition and subtraction written methods work. A super week well done Year 4.

This week Year 3 have been thinking about ways Christians look after the world and what things we can do to make a difference. The children thought of saving energy and that every little detail helps like turning off the lights and putting rubbish in the bin. They have also been excitedly preparing for our Harvest festival with lots of enthusiastic singing. They are continuing to work hard on their story planning in Literacy and in Maths have been super stars at applying their number bond knowledge for problem solving tasks.
