Dear Parents and Carers,

It might have been a very wet week but that hasn't stopped the children and their teachers doing anything! Our children have been down in the woods for Forest School, practised their football skills with Mr Brown, and enjoyed playing in the playground.

We began our week with Collective Worship, where with help from Oscar (y4) and Rosie (y1) we listened to the story of The Lion and the Mouse and learnt that even if we are small we can still make a BIG difference. As we come to the end of our first full week at Bishop Cornish it is a joy to see how well everyone is settling back into school. Visiting each classroom has seen the children working super hard and enjoying their time in school.

Our children in reception class are happily sharing what they are doing in the classroom. Today it was learning that maths is everywhere. They then practised singing their number songs. 😊 Across Year 1 and 2 the children have started their new topics - Castles and The Great Fire of London. In Year 3 and 4 the children have been collecting apples in readiness to make some tasty treats as part of DT and creating their own beasts as part of their English topic. The children in Year 5 have started to explore their topic of Ancient Greece. They shared the story of the Minotaur with me. Year 6 have had a completely different week. They have been on their residential trip at Heatree. Mrs Williams, Mrs Miller and Tim have spent a week with the children enjoying the outdoors and trying out many different activities. The children have been an absolute credit to the school. Thank you to everyone for giving the children such a wonderful experience. I end this week with a couple of reminders - Can everyone that travels to school by car please make sure that the entrance to the school is not blocked and the zig-zag yellow lines are not parked on. This is to ensure the safety of all our children and their families. I have had quite a few absence requests. It is important that children are in school. This week in school we have.....

This week Year 2 have really got stuck into their learning. They have been writing some super sentences in literacy as well as getting to grips with tens and ones in maths. They have begun to explore materials in science as well as learning about the United Kingdom in geography. They became history investigators on Monday seeing if they could find the cause of the great fire of London together. They have all settled beautifully and we are super proud of them.

This week Year 1 have been learning about the parts of a castle. We have been perfecting letter formation and writing sentences along with some fun finger gym activities. They have been superstars transitioning up to Year 1!

What a wonderful start to the year we've had in Reception! The children have settled in and are already busy with their learning! This week, we began our phonics journey by exploring the sounds m and a, and in maths we have been working on the numbers 1, 2 and 3. We've also been enjoying the story of The Colour Monster which has helped us talk about our feelings and different emotions we experience. We are so proud of how everyone has started!

This week, Year 5 have been busy explorers of both our world and the wider universe! In Geography, the children have been learning about time zones, discovering how different parts of the world experience day and night at different times. In Science, we've been fascinated by the amazing universe, investigating planets and their unique features. In Maths, the class have been working confidently with place value up to 1,000,000, showing great determination and focus.

This week Year 3 have been looking at a historical timeline and plotting out different events that they have learnt about throughout Key stage 1. They also did some outdoor learning in the woods and picked some apples which they then made some fantastic drawings of in Art. This will link to our learning about Creation and Harvest in RE over the next few weeks. We have begun our writing unit based around the story, "The Secret of Black Rock," and have also read an extract from, "George's Marvellous Medicine,"

Year 4 have had a super start to the year. We are enjoying our Geography work and have been busy exploring the countries of Europe. We are especially enjoying our English writing unit on unicorns and have used drama in our lessons too. You've all been superstars – well done.
