This week Year 2 have been working really hard on writing their own Stardust stories. They have enjoyed some tricky subtraction in maths and worked so hard. They have been starting to learn about the Victorians and are really excited to start their plant investigation next week.

This week Year 5 have been very creative. In our dance session at the start of the week, we made short sequences uses the idea of telephone numbers and the technology of communication. Science on Tuesday saw Y5 plan their own investigations to test thermal insulators and conductors. Our art and RE sessions have had our children thinking about how Islamic art may help Muslims to worship and have been developing Islamic patterns.

This week Reception class made the most of the cold weather by finding lots of ice outside! They have also been busy learning about dinosaurs in our new topic by painting their own dinosaurs and learning about fossils and they had lots of fun doing gymnastics.


This week in year 4 we have begun looking into Anglo-Saxons. We started by looking at a map showing where the Anglo-Saxon cemeteries were found. We then discussed how historians use this knowledge to determine where they lived. To follow on from this, we began exploring our art focus for the term. We explored the different materials they used to create pieces, before focusing on the Bayeux tapestry.

This week in Year 1 we have started to learn why Captain Scott is famous. We have been adding and subtracting 2 using a number line. We have also been starting to write our own exploration story about a boy who found an aeroplane.

Year 3 have had a busy week! They have been using maps and atlases to locate Egypt and investigate it's climate and geographical features; they have explored Ancient Egyptian jewellery and made some lovely drawn studies; they had lots of fun exploring rhythm in the first of our music sessions, and have been reading an explanation text about an amazing Robot cat, as well as much, much more!

Year 6 have had a great start to the new year. We have started our English work around The Journey by Francesca Sanna; this also ties in nicely with our history work about migration. Our maths topic is ratio and proportion, so they have been looking at lots of ways to express this as a ratio and fraction using prior learning. They time travelled to the future with Mrs Fletcher, arriving in the World of AI, the children were blown away!
