Dear Friends.

What a joy this past month has been – especially witnessing the installation of Bishop David as the new Bishop of Truro! It was a joyous and hopeful occasion, marking the beginning of a new chapter for our diocese. We look forward with anticipation to welcoming him here in person on 29 June, and I hope many of you will be able to come and meet him.

Another milestone this month has been the completion of our Annual Parochial Church Meetings (APCMs) for 2024. I want to thank all those who have served so faithfully in a variety of roles across our parishes, often quietly and behind the scenes. Your time, energy, and prayers are the backbone of our church life.

That said, there are still some important roles left unfilled. Each of our churches has spaces on PCCs or other teams, and I ask you to prayerfully consider whether God might be calling you to serve in some way. Whether it's helping with finance, fabric, music, flowers, outreach, or simply offering a listening ear or a warm welcome – your contribution matters more than you might imagine. No offer of time or talent is too small when it's offered in love.

On a more personal note, I wanted to share a recent discovery from my family history. Many of you know that my mum is a passionate genealogist. During her latest deep dive into our ancestry, she unearthed the record of my eight-timesgreat-grandfather, John Trease, who married Elizabeth Hodge at St Stephen's by Saltash in 1676. Even more astonishingly, she traced a connection to Edward Courtenay of Landrake, who died in 1509 – our earliest known link to the Benefice!

These findings have stirred something quite profound in me. One of my theology tutors used to say, "There are no coincidences in the places where we find ourselves. Sometimes, we are called back to our roots to awaken the saints." It's an image that has stayed with me, and one that feels especially poignant now. To think that centuries ago, my ancestors worshipped and walked in the very places I now serve is both humbling and inspiring.

In a world that often feels so transient, it's a powerful reminder that we are part of something much larger than ourselves – a living story of faith that stretches across time and place. May we continue to honour those who came before us by living lives of faith, hope, and service in our communities today.




# **Pioneering Parishes**

# Recent Events continued

#### **START**

Our February meeting at Wesley Church featured Dr Phil Jordan, a local Bee Inspector, who discussed the challenges faced by honey bees. They face threats from diseases, pesticides, hornets (European and Asian), weather, and ants stealing honey and brood from weak colonies. A major global issue is the Verroa mite parasite, which can devastate hives if untreated. Dead bees near hives are natural in summer, but excessive numbers require intervention. Chemical treatments are available, as without them, colonies may collapse in two to three years. Research at institutions such as Sussex University focuses on diseases and treatments. This eye-opening talk highlighted the vital role Honey Bees play in pollinating crops and flowers as well as the ongoing challenges they face.



The event originally scheduled for April was postponed to May. Members gathered at Wesley and arranged car shares to drive to the Beefeater for lunch before visiting Saltram House. This Georgian mansion, regarded as one of Britain's finest, was home to the Parker family from 1740 to 1957. A marriage in 1769 transformed it into a Palladian residence under architect Robert Adam. featuring exquisite plaster ceilings, an Axminster carpet, and furniture by Chippendale. The library, re-modelled in 1818, houses over 3,000 books. The gardens reflect the era's plant-collecting craze, boasting over 1,500 species from across the globe. The estate was bequeathed to the National Trust in 1957, complete with a collection of paintings, ceramics, and Chinese wallpaper. Saltram House remains a treasure of Georgian architecture and history, showcasing the family's cultural and horticultural pursuits. It was described by Nikolaus Pevsner as the most impressive country house in Devon.

The event planned for 30 May is for lunch at the Dartmoor Diner followed by a trip to Burrator Reservior under the guidance of Bob Austin.

# Parish Giving Scheme (PGS)

#### **Your Sunday Morning**

How do your Sunday mornings go? Do they ever involve scrabbling under the sofa cushions looking for enough cash to put in today's envelope? Or feeling smug because yesterday you remembered to draw enough money from the 'hole in the wall' for the envelope?

#### The Treasurer's Sunday

Now think of the church treasurer's Sunday afternoon spent opening envelopes, then counting and recording the money. And the cash still has to be banked. Even money paid by standing order needs some admin and collecting the gift aid from HMRC is no picnic (nor paid very promptly).

Surely there's a better way?



#### The Parish Giving Scheme

https://www.parishgiving.org.uk/

PGS is a registered charity that will collect our gifts by direct debit and pay it to our chosen church promptly (with the gift aid). PGS also collects one-off donations. The admin costs for the scheme are paid by the diocese.

#### **Better for Us**

We have a secure and simple method of giving with the option to increase giving annually to protect our gift against inflation. We also have peace of mind that the Direct Debit Guarantee Scheme protects our gifts.

#### **Better for the Treasurer**

The treasurer no longer has the bother of envelopes, just easy access to monthly and annual (both tax and calendar year) statements with prompt payments into the church bank account of the gift and the gift aid.

#### **Register Now!**

If you are donating by gift aid envelopes, cash or standing order, why not register for PGS? It's easy to do.

PS Do let your church treasurer know!

#### **Registered Churches**

All our churches except St Mary are registered for the Parish Giving Scheme.

#### **Register by Phone**

When you are ready to set up a new regular gift, please have your personal bank account details, church/parish name and PGS parish code (see below).

Then simply give them a call on 0333 002 1271, Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm, and they will take down all the information needed to complete your Direct Debit instruction for you. They will also ask about your preferences for opting in to Gift Aid, if you are eligible, and whether you would like to increase your gift annually by the rate of inflation.

The call usually takes about 10 minutes. They will then send you a confirmation of your new gift by post or email.

# SS Leonard & Dilpe Church Quiz - Answers

 Above the porch door is a sundial.
 Can you read the date it was installed and the current time?



#### **Answer: 1768.**

Inside the porch there is a memorial set into the wall. Who is it for?

#### Answer: Rev F V J Arundell.

(There is also a painting of Rev Arundell. Rector from 1805 to 1846. He had a grand vision of building a Spa hotel at Landulph to promote the medicinal qualities of the local water, it didn't materialise.)

3. Inside the church, can you find an ancient collections box?



Answer: Attached to the pew inside the main door is an ancient Alms Box.

4. Where can you find out the age of the church records and where they are now kept?

Answer: In the porch. The date is 1540 and the records are now kept in the County Record Office – renamed Kresen Kernow.

5. The church has a complete set of early 16th century carved bench ends; where is the dragon?



Answer: Near the lectern.

6. The Church has a fine wooden screen. What event does it feature?



Answer: The Rood Screen features the crucifixion of Jesus with the Virgin Mary and St John.

7. Where can you read the Creed?



Answer: By the rood screen on a board dating from either the 18th or early 19th century. (There is a similar board for the Lord's Prayer.)

8. One of the windows has three Bishops- can you find the window?



Answer: In the south aisle.

9. Where in the Church can you find a descendent of the Christian Emperors of Greece?



Answer: The memorial to Theodore Paleologus is next to the vestry door.

10. Can you find the wooden unicorn heads?



Answer: On the panels at the back of the Church. (There are also unicorns in the coat of arms of George II and in the coat of arms of the Lower Family.)
