*This week in school we have...*

This week Year 5 have been really enjoying and participating fully in PSHE lessons. This week they have been thinking about the changes of moving on. We have been continuing our art project 'Is graffiti art or crime?' and looking at examples of political and emotive messages. We've really enjoyed our PSHE sessions over the year.

This week in Year 4 we have had a busy week starting to write our stories in English. In between English and Aladdin rehearsals, we have been learning about polygons in maths. We looked at what a polygon is and the difference between an irregular and regular polygon.

This week in Reception Class we have been recapping lots of the maths we have learned this year including adding, subtracting and shapes. We have been starting to write postcards from the adventures that the snail and the whale went on and exploring a wider variety of language. We also had our move up day to Year 1 and had an amazing morning.

This week Year 2 have been having fun making up cheetah jokes and telling people about hunting cheetahs. They have been problem solving in maths and finding out about survival in science. They enjoyed lots of PE and learning more about different places of worship.

This week in Year 3 the children have been combining their geography and history skills to explore the Tamar valley. They learnt how to use an ordinance survey map to search for evidence of mining in the Tamar valley, noticing how many sites there were, their location, and whether the map showed that the mining was current or historical. In maths they have been exploring angles, using 'right angle measurers' to investigate angles within the classroom.

**This week we have been super writers and mathematicians along with having lots of extra fun.**

**Year 6 have continued to be busy rehearsing their production of Aladdin, writing their scripts for their Leavers' Assembly and practising for their Leavers' Service! They are being absolute stars in every sense and we are all very proud of their achievements. They have visited their next schools as part of their transition and all their handovers have been done. I am already feeling very emotional and missed them terribly on move up day but I am also very proud of their accomplishments. Way to go Year 6!**

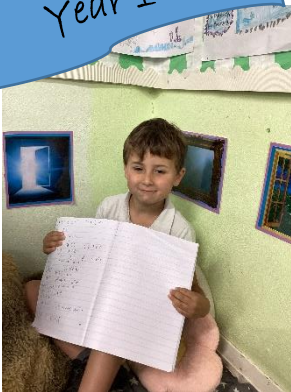

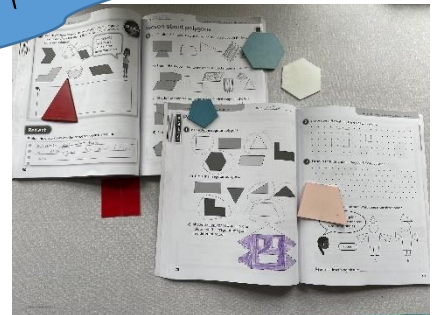
