*This week in school we have...*

This week in Year 4 we have been writing our balanced argument around the question 'Should we be allowed to feed animals in National Parks?' The class have been superb, working hard to finish their piece in a short amount of time. I am so proud of the work they have produced.

Year 2 have had a busy week exploring more about Easter and really thinking about why we call Jesus a Saviour. The children have also explored historical sources to find out where we get our facts about Florence Nightingale. They have continued to be amazing mathematicians with the five and ten times tables.

Reception Class have been exploring patterns in maths. They looked at patterns in the natural world and explored repeating patterns. They also got to try marbling to make part of their Easter cards, this amazed them all to see the paper change so quickly!

Year 6 have been researching scientists and their contributions to our lives this week. They have been able to choose a scientist who interests them to create a fact file about their life. They will be using scientist vocabulary to include write ups on their experiments which they conducted on our Harry Potter day and summarise their results. They have concluded their maths learning around converting percentages, fractions and decimals ready to move onto measurement next week. They have used Bibles to examine the Easter Story and discuss their own opinions about it, reflecting on why this is a special time of year to Christians.

This week Year 1 have been learning about Shabbat, we made Challah bread and tasted it. In maths we have been continuing with subtraction and have been getting ready for the Easter service.

This week Year 3 have enjoyed creating their Egyptian collars in Art, finishing their Howard Carter diary writing in Literacy and discussing the symbolism of the Resurrection in RE.

Year 5 have had a busy week of fun. As part of our science, we have been planting cuttings we have taken from our plants. In music we been perfecting our singing, drumming and Ukelele skills. Our history lessons on the Maya civilisation this week involved eating chocolate made by Autumn as part of her chilli challenge homework.... We can't learn about the Maya without chocolate! On Wednesday, it was National Sign Language Day, so Year 5 had a sign language lesson, they were fantastic.

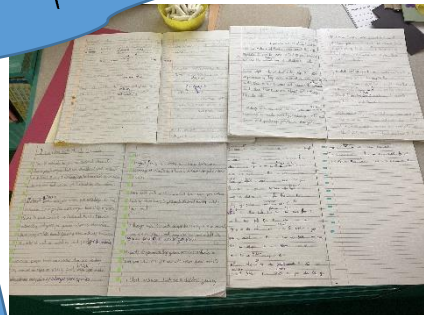
