# This week in school we have...

This week in Reception Class we have been learning how to take away 1 from a number up to 5. We have been exploring this with lots of different resources as well as with pictures. We have also been looking at the past, present and future and what all these words mean, looking at us as babies and guessing what we will be when we grow up.

This week Year 2 have been really busy showing off their reading skills and adding in different ways in maths. They have shown that they are absolute superstars. In RE they have created art work to show the good news that Jesus brings, they thought of special words that could explain what the bible tells us. They have also been amazing at practising for the Christmas play and it is going to be fabulous.

This week Year 3 celebrated Anti-Bullying Week by wearing odd socks on Tuesday and thinking about what positive things their odd socks would say to them if they could talk. They have also been learning with maps this week in History, searching for evidence of Bronze Age settlements on Dartmoor.

In our PSHE lessons in Year 5 this week, we have been looking at the theme of 'respect' as part of anti-bullying week. We discussed different ways we can show respect in a variety of situations such as in the classroom, at home, on the playground and many more. Yesterday, we really enjoyed our Ancient Greek dress up day — we all came to school dressed in our Greek finery! We began the day with an ancient Greek fashion show, then moved on to learning about why Athens was able to be so strong. We also held an Ancient Greek debate 'Should the Parthenon be built' and in the afternoon we looked at different types of columns in Greek architecture and and we sketched these — a fun day was had by all.

This week in Year 4, we've dived into some exciting new topics! In Maths, we began our new unit on multiplication and division, practising strategies that will build our confidence with these key skills. In Geography and Literacy, we researched the beautiful island of Sicily, discovering its rich culture, history, and landscapes. In Science, we explored the fascinating process of how we hear sounds, learning about the journey sound waves take to reach our ears. In History, we discussed what we think is the most important thing the Romans left us that we still use today—it led to some lively debate! It's been a fantastic week of learning!

This week Year 1 have been making poppies and thinking about all of those who have fought for our freedoms. We have been writing our stories about an adventurous boy and adding in Maths as well as P.E. with Mr Brown.

Year 6 have been very busy this week. They have started their duties as playground leaders, which they have done sensibly and maturely. They have been continuing their DT and have worked really well in their groups to create a realistic shelter. They have researched Charles Dickens to find out more about him to understand the man behind the character of Scrooge to construct their persuasive letters. At swimming they have had a super splashing time in their pyjamas practising their survival skills.


