In Art, the children created abstract art using paint based on the artist Sir Frank Bowling. During RE, we are continuing to learn 'What Sikhs believe' and this week explored their place of worship - the Gurdwara. In Music, we are continuing to learn the ukelele and have been practising singing and performing for the school play.
