This week in school we have......

This week Year 2 have been enjoying writing more of their diary entries about the Great fire. They have been super at problem solving in maths and have tried so hard with working out what to do. They created scratch pictures in art and explored the story of the ten lepers in RE. They did some super gymnastics for PE and have just been amazing all week.

In Year 5 this week, the children have been writing their independent pieces, showcasing their hard work, creativity, and growing confidence as writers. In Maths, we have been exploring multiplying and dividing by 10, 100, and 1000. The children have worked brilliantly on recognising patterns and applying their place-value knowledge. In History, we looked at the events of the Ancient Greek Olympics and explored how they compare to the modern-day Olympics we all know and love. The children discovering enjoyed similarities, differences, and the origins of some of today's events.

Year 4 had a lovely morning practising our sewing this week, with different types of stitching, ready for our Christmas stockings. In English we are building up to our final write-up of our travel brochure. In Maths, we continued with multiplying, in History we looked at Roman villas and in Geography we studied the difference between northern and southern Europe.

This week in Reception class, rehearsals for our Christmas play are now well underway and the children have been busy practising their songs - and for some of us, our speaking lines too! In RE, we have been learning about the Nativity story and exploring how Christians around the world celebrate Christmas. The children enjoyed discovering different traditions and talking about what Christmas means to people in various countries. We also have been looking at 'e' in phonics and space in maths.

This week in Year 1 we have been doing our Big Write - we have been amazing authors! We have also been super scientists making waterproof structures. In RE we looked at why Jesus was special to Christians and much more...

This week Year 3 were excited to be asked to make decorations for the Christmas tree festival at St Nicholas and St Faith Church. They worked really hard to create some beautiful angels, we were by their determination, impressed perseverance and team work. They then used their skills to design and make their own festive decorations. They also became history detectives, searching OS maps of Dartmoor to find evidence of life. They Age identified settlements, standing stones, hut circles and more.

Year 6 have made electrical circuits to light up their Anderson Shelters this week. They looked amazing! They were very curious to see which conductors could make their bulbs light up so used lots of different materials to test. In history, they researched rationing during WWII and created their own rationing books as part of art. In Spanish, they learnt about education in Spain and learnt words to describe their school uniform and resources. They have been given their words to practise ready for the Christingle which they are quite excited about.
