In our RE lessons we have been finding out about what the Torah says about Jewish food rules – we've really enjoyed making a Kosher menu. We have really enjoyed learning about David Attenborough as part of our English unit of work... it was great fun to work out the real and fake facts Mrs Jones gave us.

This week Year 3 have been writing their own explanation texts about a robotic pet and they've done a fantastic job by including some amusing ideas and creative description. They have also been learning about the pyramids in History and using evidence to try and work out who built them.

This week, Year 4 has been busy exploring a range of exciting topics! The children have finished writing their beautiful poems inspired by the River Tamar, showcasing their creativity, and understanding of the local environment. In Religious Education, we learned about the significance of Ganesha to Hindus, deepening our knowledge of cultural traditions. Our Science lessons have kicked off with an exploration of different food chains, where the children are beginning to understand the interconnections between plants and animals. We rounded off the week with swimming, where the children have been performing brilliantly, making great progress!

Year 6 have completed their mouldy bread experiments and are well aware now that dirty hands grow bacteria!!! We had a really great visit to Saltash Community school to watch their awesome production of Mary Poppins. We have completed our stories in English and hopefully they have brought you home a copy to read. I hope you all have a good half term and look forward to seeing you all after the break.

This week Year 1 have continued numbers within 20. They have been learning about Hanukkah and have cooked some Katse and started to make dreidels. We have been learning about past tense using the suffix 'ed' and much more.

They have also squeezed in some maths and learning about different places of worship.
