This week in school we have...

The Reception Class children are super excited about their new topic - DINOSAURS! This week they have learnt about Mary Anning and fossil hunting, as well as creating some dinosaur artwork. They have been working with sets of numbers 6, 7 and 8 in maths.

This week Year 2 have been very busy getting back into their learning. They have started a new topic about Victorians and have learnt who Queen Victoria was and about the different parts of the United Kingdom. They have also started some new learning in science about plants and they have set up a new experiment to find out what plants need to grow. They have also started to learn about taking photographs of different things and how ICT can help us.

This week Year 3 have started a new RE topic, exploring the Trinity. They thought about the meaning of 'Tri', then watched a video of Jesus's Baptism and identified the three aspects of the Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The children were amazing in recalling previous knowledge and explaining their ideas. They then looked at artists' work and created their own beautiful artwork to represent the Trinity.

Year 5 have had a super first week back together. We have enjoyed our new book 'The Explorer' and we used drama to help explore the characters. The children were very good at role playing a workaholic and a young lad who wants to be an explorer. In our RE, we have started looking at the faith of Judaism and discussing a range of Jewish artefacts, symbols and our thoughts on these.

This week in Year 4, we have been busy exploring a variety of exciting topics! In PSHE, we focused on our hopes and dreams for the future, discussing our aspirations and how we can work towards achieving them .In English, we began our next unit with a beautiful poem by Valerie Bloom. We've enjoyed reading and reflecting on her words, and we can't wait to dive deeper into her work in the coming days. Our science lessons have been particularly fun as we started an investigation to observe the effects of fizzy drinks on our teeth. Using eggs as a model for teeth, we've placed them in different fizzy drinks and will be observing the results over the next week to understand the impact of sugary drinks.

Year 6 have got off to a flying start this week, we have started our new topic of the Islamic Golden Age in History/ Geography. In our RE topic Hinduism we have revisited the gods and talked about how they all link together. Our art is based on Islamic art and the children have created some amazing pictures and designs of Fatimas hand which is a symbol of good luck.

This week in Year 1 we have been learning the shape of our firework poem and doing some amazing tie dyeing. We have looked at the climate in Antarctica and talked about Captain Scott.
