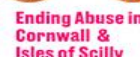

Following their victory in the Qualifying Tournament at Wadebridge where they won all five matches, scoring 27 goals and conceding only 2, the girls travelled to Falmouth last Friday for the County Finals with a lot of confidence. Winning their first and second matches (3-1 & 3-0), they then got off to a bad start in their 3rd game, going 1-0 down. However, they showed great team spirit, eventually coming from behind to win 3-1. They then won their 4th and 5th matches (both 4-0) to eventually end the tournament as ESFA Cornwall County Champions. To put this in perspective, in the two tournaments we played 10 games, winning all of them, scoring an incredible 47 goals and conceding only 3. This is an outstanding achievement for the girls and the school in general.



This now qualifies them to represent Cornwall in the English Schools FA South West England Finals in Bristol on March 22nd. A massive well done girls! Thank you so much too to all the wonderful parents for their magnificent support- it really felt like we had an extra player!

This week in school we have...

In Reception class this week we have been looking at the local Folklore about the Cornish Knockers. We have been looking at what a folklore is and who these mischievous little creatures are. We then have been making pasties and making sure if any knockers come to school to visit us, they are kept happy and not causing a mess! We have also been looking at positional language in maths and learning to describe the position of different things around us.

This week in Year 2 we have been super busy. The children have made some amazing pictures in RE based on the work of a local artist. In maths we have been working on subtracting and using our bonds to 10 to help us. In history and literacy we have been continuing to learn more about the Great Fire of London and have been writing a diary using our historical knowledge. We have also been practising our amazing play and the children have been fabulous.

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This week in Year 6 we had a visit from Mrs Straw. She brought an amazing amount of WW2 objects and pictures for us to look at. We have been writing newspaper reports from Bethlehem, on the birth of Jesus. In PE the children have been doing invasions games with Mr Brown and it was our last swimming session this week so they had fun, fun, fun!

Year 5 are getting ready for Christmas...we have started designing our Christmas stockings and have begun to learn some different sewing stitches which we will be using to join fabric together. We have all worked very hard in our English lessons, writing interesting and varied sentences about Ancient Greece and also being historians in the process. As part of our chili challenge homework, some children have used their fabulous art skills to produce some lovely artwork showing Greek pops – well done everyone.

This week, Year 4 have been busy exploring creativity, history, and thoughtful discussions! In literacy, the children impressed us with their persuasive writing skills, crafting enticing sentences about the delicious Sicilian food, fascinating sights, and thrilling activities the island offers. In DT, we began making Roman shields. The children showed their artistic flair by painting and designing symbols to decorate their shields. In R.E., we had meaningful discussions about the impact of the Holy Spirit on the lives of Christians, reflecting on how faith can inspire and guide people.

This week Year 1 completed their adventure stories writing them in full. They did jumping in PE, looked at The Nativity story in R.E and found landmarks in the UK in geography.

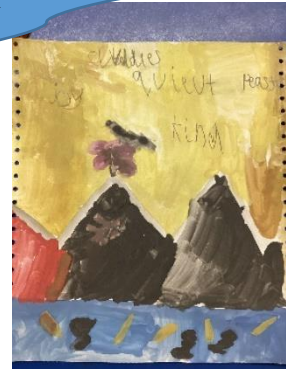
