This week in school we have...

This week in Reception, we have continued exploring *Stick Man*, thinking carefully about how he might have felt when he was away from his family tree. The children came up with some brilliant vocabulary to describe his emotions. We also explored where we live and compared this to different places around the world, considering where else Stick Man might have travelled on his adventures. In Phonics, we have been focusing on our red words and have been practising extremely hard to recognise and remember them. Whilst in Maths we have been learning about the composition of numbers 5 to 9. Finally in Jigsaw we have spoken about friendships and discussed what we can do if we fall out with our friends.

This week the Year 3's have been learning about farming in Cornwall. They've looked on Google Earth to discover how much land is used for farming and have investigated what is grown and produced in Cornwall. They have also learnt about the legend of the Mermaid of Zennor and read the story of the Mousehole cat which is set in Cornwall. In RE they have been discussing forgiveness and created some paper boats with inspiring messages on them.

This week Year 6 have demonstrated all their values. They have sat their assessments with positive mindsets, determination, and perseverance. The whole school is so proud of them, and they should be proud of themselves. They have thoroughly enjoyed their special breakfast treats; I can't believe how much they can eat! It was so lovely to surprise them with the trip to Bounce; they had an amazing time to celebrate the end of their assessments.

This week in Year 1, we have been writing our own stories inspired by Grandad's Island. We have been learning about deciduous and evergreen trees. Thinking about halves and quarters. Doing some art around belonging in R.E. and much more.

This week Year 2 have loved building their micro habitats in the wood. They also went animal mad in geography where they explored national parks in Africa and even designed their own. In literacy they have been amazing writers and Mrs. Oakes has been astounded by their progress. In maths they have tackled time and are getting really good at working out what time a clock is showing. They loved their African dancing session and can't wait to bring their shield designs to life next week.

This week, Year 4 have been working hard in their maths lessons learning about money. We really enjoyed setting out classroom up as a shop to bring this topic to life. In our science lessons, we have been finding out about both air and water pollution and how this can cause global warming - everyone was really interested in this and could share thoughtful ideas about ways in which we can help with this. We have also been artists by studying and then sketching in detail a selection of Viking knot patterns - they look amazing.

This week in Year 5, we have been exploring how Christians may use God's words in the *Exodus* story to support them in tricky situations. In Science, we explored the life cycle of birds by dissecting an egg to observe the different parts that enable a bird to grow and develop. In Maths, we have been using bar models to represent finding fractions of a quantity in different contexts.
