This week in school we have.....

This week Year 2 have delved deeper into the key events of the great fire of London. They have investigated what happened and how we know using different sources of evidence. In maths they have continued to work on place value and are moving forward quickly. They have written some super sentences in literacy and loved sharing their collections. They have also loved exploring the UK in geography. They have also started their harvest preparations which they were very excited about.

We've had a fun and busy week in Reception! The children have been working hard on their counting skills, focusing on numbers up to 5. In phonics, we explored the letter 't' and revisited all the sounds we've learned so far. We have also had not one but two very special visitors: a dentist came in to talk to us about keeping our teeth healthy and the local firefighters stopped by to show us their fire equipment (including a fire engine!) and talk about fire safety.

This week in Year 5, we have been comparing and ordering numbers up to 100,000 and even 1,000,000 in our maths. In PSHE, we explored the challenges refugees and asylum seekers may face when moving from their home countries, developing empathy and understanding. In our Geography, we built on our knowledge of fair trade and investigated how far the ingredients in some of our favourite meals must travel before they reach our plates.

This week Year 3 have been exploring where stone Age people lived during different time periods. They have particularly focussed on the Palaeolithic Age and have been taking a look at cave paintings. The children made some careful observations and produced some excellent sketches of animals from cave Art. They have also been revisiting the Christian Creation story in RE and made some beautiful paintings of God's creation to display in our classroom.

This week in Year 1 we have been writing sentences about dragons, knights and castles. We have been comparing groups in maths, labelling objects with properties in science and drawing what we are thankful for.

At the start of the week, Year 4 were learning about Jesus calling Peter and Andrew to "Come follow me". We took our learning outside and 'hot seated' Peter and Andrew to see how they might have felt in the situation – fabulous responses from Year 4. We have also been completing our end of unit writing – the amazing non-chronological reports on unicorns have been written. Our history lesson began with a discussion on why on earth would Caesar want to leave sunny Italy and invade a colder country on the edge of the empire? Interesting response all around.

Year 6 have been revisiting place value up to 10,000,000 this week. They have been learning how to write 6 digit numbers in words and partitioning numbers to show their understanding of value and rounding them to the nearest 1,000, 10,000 and 100,000. In English we have been writing complex sentences using relative clauses and metaphors to create imagery. In Spanish, they continue their grammar work written and verbal and delve deeper into the Spanish culture.

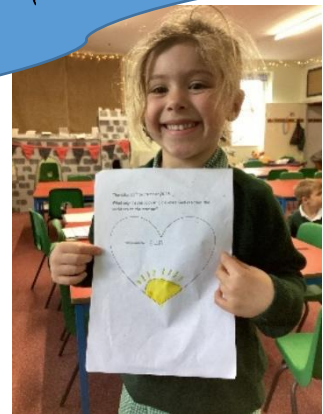
