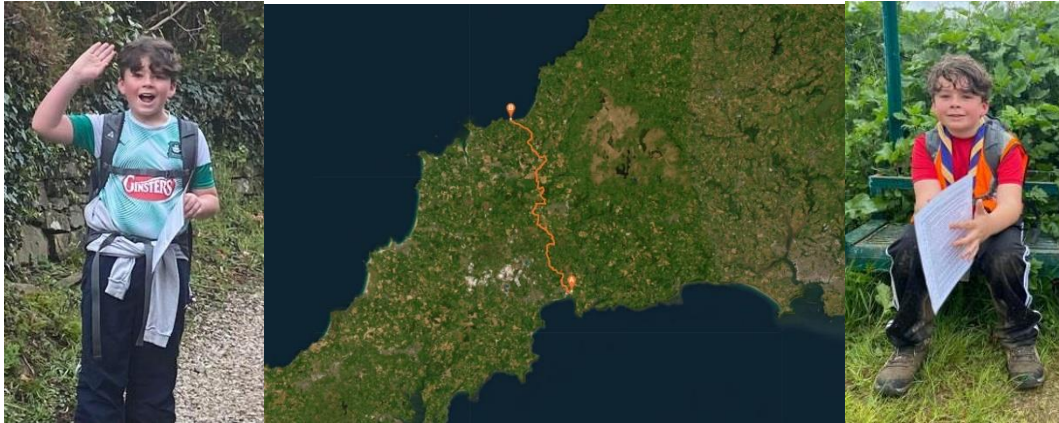

Coast to Coast Challenge Hike 2023



On Friday 28th April, Barney in Year 6 joined together with 5 other Scouts from the 2nd Saltash Tamar Scout Troop, to participate in this year's Cornwall Scouts annual Coast to Coast Challenge Hike.

Following a different course every year, the fundamental element of the hike each year never changes, that is, participants must travel on foot, navigating their way, mainly off roads, from one coast of the county to the other at roughly the mid-point. Teams cover a distance of approximately 30 'country' often muddy miles!

After spending Friday evening under canvas, an early start of 0530 for breakfast awaited Barney and his team before being transported to the start of their epic journey on the south coast of Cornwall, at Par beach.

With registration complete, their route initially took them through areas of Cornwall's China Clay mining heritage by following dis-used tramways up into the beautiful Luxulyan valley, where they joined the Saint's Way, a probable route used by early Christian traveller's making their way from Ireland to Europe and thus avoiding the risky sea voyage around Land's End.

Picking up the Camel trail, the route took them to their overnight camping stop, near Pencarrow House, where they refuelled and rested overnight before continuing again the following morning.

Sunday, teams made their way across the countryside up onto the Atlantic coast in north Cornwall, finally reaching their goal and destination of the seaside fishing village of Port Isaac.

Barney has shown incredible courage and resilience, attending all the training weekends in order to achieve success!

He successfully completed the 30 miles (in excess of 65000 steps) in 15 hours and 3 minutes!

His unwavering determination is inspiring and hopefully his achievement will encourage others to attain the goals in life they set out to achieve!
