## This week in school we have...

This week Year 5 have been thinking about how Christians show freedom and justice. We have completed some beautiful pictures to advertise lessons, we have been working hard on our sentence construction and discussing if children are becoming lazy due to too much screen use... very interesting discussions are happening here!
