This week in school we have...

This week Year 6 have been brushing up on their cycling skills and practising safely riding on the roads. Rehearsals are in full swing and the children are sounding amazing. In English we have continued with our work on poetry about the peppered moth which they are loving and already two of the children have spotted one on their way home.

This week Year 1 have been phonics superstars. They have made historical seaside posters, designed some mythical sea creatures and practised for Sports Day. They have also been getting to grips with money in our new shop.

This week in Reception Class, we have been learning about Stickman. The children loved following his adventures and learning about his journey back to the family tree. We used the story to talk about families and the children enthusiastically shared who is in their own families, describing mums, dads, siblings and even pets! We have also been learning about shape in maths, bible stories in RE and in phonics practising our sounds.

This week in Year 4, we've been exploring the topic of baptism in our RE lessons. We discussed what it means to be baptised and why it is an important part of many people's faith. In maths, we continued working on our unit about time, solving more challenging problems, and improving our ability to read both analogue and digital clocks. In English, we have been writing eye-witness accounts inspired by sightings of a mysterious creature. The children used their imaginations to describe what characters saw, heard, and felt during these strange encounters!

This week Year 2 have had great fun celebrating their 2000 dojos. They chose a spa day and Year 2 smelt beautiful as we played with bath bombs and had our nails done. In literacy we have started writing our own version of a report about cheetahs. In maths we explored the tricky subject of time and are starting to get to grips with it. We made shields in art and found out more about prophet Muhammad in RE. In science we learnt about how food gets to the supermarket and what has to happen to it before it goes.

This week Year 3 have been using charcoal and chalks to create some drawings of tin mines based around our project about Cornwall. They have also been practising their skills with telling the time in Maths and doing their independent write, inspired by the story, "The Incredible Book Eating Boy."

In Spanish, Year 5 have been practising the vocabulary for colours and weather. To link with this, the children have been learning about Spanish speaking countries in South America and learning about the physical and human features of these. In our RE unit of work, we have been discussing how we see the world and what this means to us. Year 5 have also been working exceptionally hard in their maths lessons learning all about decimals.
