This week in school we have...

This week in Year 2 we have done lots of learning about the Great Fire of London. They have sequenced, acted out and though about the different firefighting methods that were used and why they weren't effective. They have also done some super adding in maths and shown that they are number bond masters. In RE they planned pictures all about peace and are looking forward to creating them next week.

This week in Reception Class we have been looking at Guy Fawkes and why we celebrate bonfire night. We looked at how to keep ourselves safe around both bonfires and fireworks. We have also been looking at Remembrance Day and what it means, we started making poppies to decorate the classroom with. We have been looking at adding up to 5 and looking at nursery rhymes and fairytales.

This week Year 3 have been learning about the Bronze Age as part of our topic and have created some drawings of bronze aged jewellery. They have also been doing some amazing descriptive writing based on the story, 'Stone Age Boy'. Year 5 have had a super start to our half term. In our history learning, we have been finding out about the Ancient Olympic Games. We even held our own Olympic Games in our PE sessions... bending the les slightly to allow girls to take part though! We have also enjoyed beginning our new unit of work on Islam in RE and spent time in our woods session discussing big questions about God and why there are different religions.

This week Year 4 have been transported to the breathtaking island of Sicily! Using holiday brochures, they explored the unique culture, history, and landscapes of this fascinating Mediterranean island. In Maths we have also been busy finding the area of rectilinear shapes, developing their skills in measuring shapes. In PSHE, we've launched our new topic, *Celebrating Difference*, where we're learning to appreciate and respect what makes each of us unique. Adding to the adventure, the children became archaeologists, uncovering the ruins of an ancient Roman villa! They investigated the remains, examining artifacts and discovering the secrets these ruins held.

This week in Year 1 we have been starting to write stories about an adventurous boy and have been historians sorting through pictures of lifeboats through the ages. We have done some gymnastics and much more.

This week Year 6 have been working really hard on their maths with order of operations and brackets, they are also mastering the art of perspective to improve their Henry Moore artwork. They have made a great start on their Anderson Shelters. In English they have been analysing a persuasive letter written to Max the Grinch's dog, examining what is important to have during the war. Ration books, they decided, were very important!
